E Safety Policy

IT Equipment

- Only ICT equipment belonging to the setting will be used by staff and children.
- The settings manager (Designated Person) is responsible for ensuring all ICT equipment is safe and fit for purposes.
- All computers will have virus protection installed.
- If a second hand computer is purchased or donated to the setting, the designated person will ensure that no inappropriate material is stored on it before the children use it.
- All computers for use by children will be sited in an area clearly visible to staff.

Internet Access

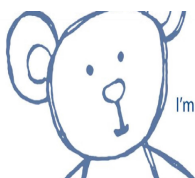
- Children will not be allowed to access social networking sites whilst in the setting.
- Staff will report any suspicious or offensive material, including material which may incite racism, bullying or discrimination to www.iwf.org.uk
- Suspicions that an adult is attempting to make inappropriate contact with a child on-line is reported to www.ceop.police.uk: the Child Exploitation and On-line Protection Centre.

Mobile Phones

- Children should not bring mobile phones with them to the setting.
- When a child is found to have a mobile phone with them, this will be removed and locked in the cupboard until the parent collects the child at the end of session.

Cyber Bullying

- When members of staff become aware that a child is the victim of cyber-bullying, they will discuss this with the parents and refer them to sources of help, such as:
